

It is happening as the District Board promised. We are following the sun and lighting up test areas with solar lights. As of now, the testing is limited, but we will be expanding the testing scope in the coming weeks. Currently we have five test lamps in the MA parking lot that are exhibiting a great deal of potential for savings. This solar light is both light and motion sensitive. The light sensitive component will activate when natural area light is reduced. The lighting component will function at 25% brightness capacity when natural light is reduced and there is no active movement. The motion detector component will increase lighting capacity brightness to full capacity when activated by motion. It seems that every night that I go to the MA parking lot to check out the function of the solar lights there is a District Director already there and they are usually humming that infectious Herman Hermits song about a lamppost. The continuing testing and evaluation will provide us with an accurate understanding and calculation of the financial and functional benefits. We have also placed various other motion and light sensitive lighting fixtures in other locations throughout the community. We will keep you updated as we follow the sun.




See You in September (the Tempos)
